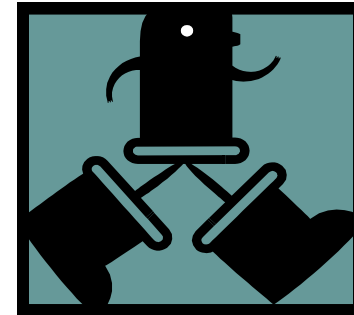

Seating for Computer Lab classes is limited and students must be registered on a class by class basis. Classes will be closed when the available seats are filled.

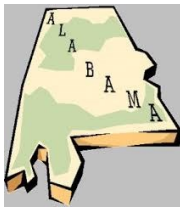

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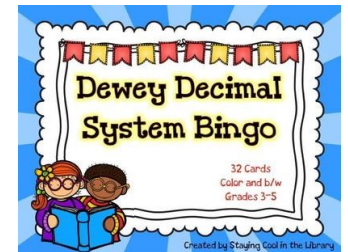
