All We Were Promised by Ashton Lattimore

Sent to stay with her father, 15-year-old Pia, rebelling against her stepmother when COVID sends them into isolation, finds her life colliding with Athyna, who's caring for a toddler full time, as they spiral toward different tragedies.

Miss Morgan's Book Brigade by Janet Skeslien Charles

A novel based on the true story of Jessie Carson—the American librarian who changed the literary landscape of France.

Museum of Lost Quilts, The by Jennifer Chiaverini

Summer, the youngest member of Elm Creek Quilts, researches the antique quilts on display for a fundraiser to renovate the headquarters of the Waterford Historical Society, and discovers its troubled history of racism, economic injustice and political corruption, past and present.

Only the Brave by Danielle Steel

During World War II, Sophia Alexander becomes involved in the resistance, and while working with the convent nuns, the Sisters of Mercy, she risks everything to help those in need—no matter what the cost.

Paris Novel, The by Ruth Reichl

Stella travels to Paris where she meets an art collector who introduces her to the who's who of the Paris literary, culinary and art worlds, helping her understand what it means to live a larger life.

Calamity of Souls, A by David Baldacci

In a Virginia courtroom in 1968, a white lawyer and a black attorney must bridge their differences to fight for a black man's life against racial prejudice and powerful forces seeking to undo civil rights progress.

City in Ruins by Don Winslow

A Las Vegas casino mogul with a sordid past must fight for the life he created and everything he holds dear after old enemies surface.

Darling Girls by Sally Hepworth

Two women who escaped a strict home with a foster mother on a farm are called back to their childhood home and into the orbit of their former guardian when human bones are discovered beneath the farmhouse.

Daughter of Mine by Megan Miranda

Returning to Mirror Lake after inheriting her childhood home, Hazel discovers long-hidden secrets that may explain the mystery of her mother's disappearance.

Extinction by Douglas Preston

One of Us Knows by Alyssa Cole

From the author comes a thriller about the new caretaker of a historic estate who finds herself trapped on an island with the ghosts of her past—and a murderer.

Reaper Follows, The by Heather Graham

Agents from the FBI and Florida Department of Law Enforcement investigate a series of murders linked to conspiracy theorists and doomsday cults.

Safe and Sound by Laura McHugh

Sisters Amelia and Kylee, when human remains are discovered in town, search for the truth surrounding their cousin Grace's disappearance, determined to find her dead or alive, but soon find themselves fighting to save their own lives.

She's Not Sorry by Mary Kubica

Full time nurse Meghan Michaels, when it is revealed her patient with a traumatic brain injury did not jump from a bridge but was pushed, lets herself get too close to the case.

Toxic Prey, No. 34 by John Sandford

When an expert in infectious diseases disappears without a trace, Letty Davenport, with the world on high alert, and when their worst fears are confirmed, must race against time to stop the virus he created from becoming the perfect weapon.

Vacancy in Room 10, The by Seraphina Nova Glass

A run-down apartment complex is packed with shady characters willing to go to deadly lengths to keep their darkest secrets from the stranger in their midst.

While We Were Burning by Sara Koffi

Hiring a personal assistant named Brianna to distract her from her obsession with her best friend's death, Elizabeth does not realize Brianna has her own agenda—to find out why the police killed her young son—and immerses herself in Elizabeth's life where the answers to her questions lie.

You Know What You Did by K.T. Nguyen

When her mother dies suddenly, Annie Shaw finds her OCD coming back with a vengeance, and when the investigation zeroes in on her, her mind increasingly fractures and the only thing she knows is this: she will do anything to protect her daughter even if it means losing herself.
