Historical Fiction

Black Butterflies by Priscilla Morris

Zora, an artist and teacher, sends her husband and elderly mother safely to England but stays in Sarajevo to fight and rebuild as the city fractures along ethnic lines during the Balkan conflict in 1992.

Hanging Party, The, No. 1 by William W. Johnstone and J.A. Johnstone

A legendary gunslinger tries to outrun his past and start a new life, but after so many years, so many bullets, and so much bloodshed he finds old habits die hard.

Lady Macbeth by Ava Reid
